KEY CHARACTERISTICS

- A US-FOCUSED BALANCED FUND, onemarkets Capital Group US Balanced fund is born by the collaboration from UniCredit and Capital Group, which has helped investors navigate multiple market cycles since 1975. The Portfolio Manager has a track record of growth with downside resilience across multiple decades, enabling it to play an anchor role in long-term investors' portfolios.²
- INVESTMENT EXPERIENCE. The fund is managed by an experienced team of 12 portfolio managers, with a median of 28 years' investment experience and 22 years with Capital Group.
- DIVERSIFIED PORTFOLIO: onemarkets Capital Group US Balanced Fund has no benchmark, and it can invest in different types of financial instruments such as equities and debt securities. In a limited manner, the fund can also invest in asset backed securities, mortgage-backed securities or derivatives

- CONSERVATION, INCOME AND GROWTH. onemarkets Capital Group US Balanced Fund seeks the balanced accomplishment of three objectives: conservation of capital, current income and long-term growth of capital and income.
- US OPPORTUNITIES. onemarkets Capital Group US Balanced Fund invests primarily in us-domiciled securities across blue-chip dividend-paying equities and investment grade fixed income to offer a defensive diversification opportunity to European investors.
- MARKET VOLATILITY. The fund aims to tackle investor challenges such as market volatility, high inflation, and high interest rates.

1. WHAT MAKES THIS FUND UNIQUE?



- This onemarkets Capital Group US Balanced fund is designed on UniCredit's clients' needs. It combines one of the world's largest and oldest multi-asset strategies³ aiming to offer long-term, prudent exposure to the US economy to the needs and the preferences of UniCredit Group clients. Allocation between equity and fixed income will vary depending on the convictions of individual portfolio managers, but on average the 85% of the portfolio is invested in quality income-paying⁴ US equities and bonds⁵, that combine to potentially deliver capital appreciation and downside resilience. This portfolio was designed in reference to a 45 year old strategy that has only experienced five calendar years of negative returns over its lifetime, and navigated across multiple market events such as the Tech Bubble Burst in 2000, Global Financial Crisis in 2008, and COVID-19 pandemic.⁶

2. HOW DO YOU BUILD THE PORTFOLIO?



- The strategy seeks to deliver on all three objectives: conservation of capital, current income and long-term growth of capital and income, over a full market cycle using a multi-asset portfolio.
- The equity portfolio focuses on blue-chip, dividend-paying companies, but with flexibility for more growth-oriented, non-dividend-payers. We look for quality companies that can successfully navigate market volatility, including higher inflation and interest rate environments. The bond portfolio primarily aims to offset equity volatility, with income secondary, and avoids buying high-yield bonds.
- Our approach seeks the opportunities of both worlds: the high conviction of individual managers and the diversification of a team. It brings together all of Capital Group's extensive equity and fixed income research management capabilities together in one portfolio³. The blend of managers is designed to lower volatility while striving for consistently positive long-term returns.

3. HOW DOES THE SELECTION PROCESS WORK?



- Our research efforts draw on the insights of experienced analysts, many of whom have observed companies and industries through multiple cycles. Our investment analysts not only provide investment ideas to portfolio managers but are also able to act on the courage of their convictions by managing a portion of the portfolio via the research portfolio. Our on-the-ground research is combined with comprehensive macro analysis, with equity and fixed income analysts working together to pool resources.
- Our research team includes a group of macro and quantitative analysts who provide information and insights into global and regional macroeconomics and market conditions across asset classes. These views are communicated to portfolio managers to help them in their decision-making process.

4. WHAT IS THE INVESTMENT PROCESS?



- In my role as Principal Investment Officer, I lead asset allocation discussions among the portfolio managers and am responsible for the risk of the overall portfolio.
- We apply a long-term perspective when selecting securities and determining asset allocation in line with our investment objectives.
- Equity allocation is typically 60 – 65% of the portfolio but – according to the Portfolio Manager's conviction – the strategy can vary from the 50% to 75% respectively. The fixed income allocation acts as a diversifier to equities during market volatility while contributing to the overall objectives on its own.

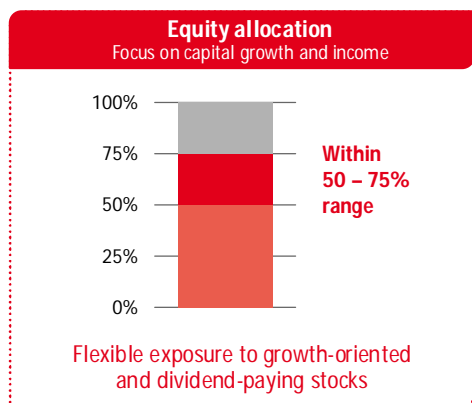

5. MODEL ALLOCATION

The portfolio manager team seeks to invest in attractively valued stocks of companies and primarily investment-grade bonds (which have a credit rating of BBB- / Baa3 or better), with the flexibility to invest up to 20%⁷ of the strategy's assets outside the US (which include up to 5% in emerging markets such as Hong-King Stock and China Bond) where interesting opportunities may exist.

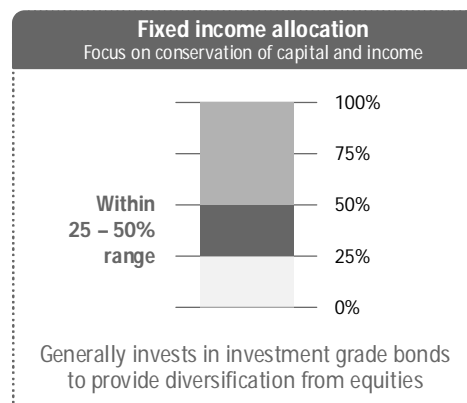

PROFILE OF POTENTIAL INVESTORS



- An investment in this Sub-Fund is designed for investors with a medium to long-term investment horizon who want to access the US equity and bond markets, and who seek growth with conservation of capital and income.
- The investor must be prepared to accept an increased level of volatility and potentially high capital losses in order to achieve above-average potential investment returns.
- Capital Group manages equity assets through three investment groups. These groups make investment and proxy voting decisions independently. Fixed income investment professionals provide fixed income research and investment management across the Capital organisation; however, for securities with equity characteristics, they act solely on behalf of one of the three equity investment groups.
